TO NSPE STUDENT MEMBER FOR  
2003 STEINMAN FELLOWSHIP  
SPONSORED BY  
NSPE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION**

NSPE is pleased to announce it is accepting applications for the **2003 NSPE Steinman Foundation Fellowship** for graduate study in engineering. This annual award rotates among the six NSPE regions. In 2003, an NSPE student member in the southwest region (AR, CO, LA, NM, OK, TX, WY) will be the recipient.

The Steinman Foundation Fellowship has been created to honor NSPE founder, David B. Steinman, who, in 1934, brought together a group of prominent engineers to create a new engineering society to embrace engineering issues that were both universal and in the public interest.

**Eligibility Requirements**

Applicants must be NSPE Student Members (may join at time of submitting application) who:

- are currently seniors in engineering at an EAC-ABET accredited program
- have taken or passed the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) exam (award is contingent on confirmation of passing)
- have been accepted in a graduate program in engineering at a school whose undergraduate or graduate program is EAC-ABET accredited
- are U.S. citizens

**Evaluation Criteria**

Applications will be evaluated based on:

- grade point average
- passing the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) exam
- internship/co-op experience and involvement in other activities
- faculty recommendation(s)
- ethics essay

**Required Application Materials**

Applications must include the following:

- NSPE Student Membership number (or membership application)
- Proof of having passed or taken the Fundamentals of Engineering exam
- Proof of acceptance into a graduate program in engineering at a school whose undergraduate or graduate program is EAC-ABET accredited
- Official transcript from an EAC-ABET accredited undergraduate program at a school located in the NSPE Southwestern Region (AR, CO, LA, NM, OK, TX, WY)
- A resume or summary of internship/co-op experience(s) and involvement in other activities

- Recommendations from faculty members who have taught the applicant (at least one recommendation is required; additional will receive consideration)
- A 500 word (maximum) essay on "The Importance of Ethics in the Practice of Engineering."

All applicants will be notified of the final selection by June 1, 2003. The winner will be invited to attend the Excellence Awards Banquet at the 2003 NSPE Annual Convention and Exposition in San Antonio, Texas, July 10-15. The fellowship will be paid in two installments: the first \$5,000 by September, 2003 and the second \$5,000 by April, 2004, upon receipt of a letter from the student's faculty advisor summarizing the student's progress to date and commitment toward obtaining a graduate degree in engineering. Upon completion of the graduate degree, the winner will be required to submit a report on the value of the NSPE Educational Foundation support and their objectives regarding professional development, ethical practice, and licensure.
